

2024 SUMMARY

For over 119 years, the Putnam History Museum (PHM) has served residents, visitors, and historical researchers of Putnam County. Putnam County's generous funding, along with the support of our members, friends, and visitors, has enabled the PHM to establish a world-class special collections library and archive, to preserve the West Point Foundry schoolhouse as the museum headquarters, and to create hundreds of public programs, exhibitions, and publications.

In 2024, we achieved significant milestones with the help of both public and private support:

- Opened the exhibition "Revolutionary Visions: Women in the Hudson Highlands during the American Revolution" which featured the work of five local artists interpreting historical women.
- Engaged the community with educational programs on key themes such as: Native Americans, the Colonial Period, the American Revolution, Women's History, and more.
- Hosted 11 lectures covering a wide range of subjects to further engage with the community.
- Dedicated more than 400 research hours to over 50 public research requests.
- Hosted, co-hosted, or collaborated on over 45 public programs, enhancing historical curiosity and appreciation within the mid-Hudson region.

Looking ahead to 2025, we are excited to embark on several key projects focused on financial sustainability, infrastructure improvements, program expansion, digitization, and strategic planning.

We extend our deepest gratitude to all our supporters for their continued trust and support. Your contributions significantly impact the Putnam History Museum, enabling us to preserve our shared heritage and inspire future generations.

• Initiatives for the next fiscal year:

Financial Sustainability

 Develop a robust multi-year financial plan to ensure the museum's financial stability, including fundraising initiatives, grant applications, and exploring potential revenue streams.

Sustainability and Infrastructure

A major goal is to secure funding to replace the aging furnace and HVAC, IT equipment (two laptops, operating software upgrade), and building maintenance and improvements, to ensure the long-term sustainability of the museum.

Digitization and Online Presence

 Continuing to digitize our historic collection and expanding the museum's online presence.

Strategic Planning

The museum's current Strategic Plan ran through the end of 2024. With the hiring of the new Executive Director, the PHM Board of Trustees and staff will work to develop a Strategic Plan for 2025–2028. This plan will provide a roadmap for growth and sustainability.





Research

The PHM offers comprehensive research services, catering to a wide range of inquiries related to Putnam County history and culture. Varied inquiries include genealogy, house histories, local landmarks, historical events, and cultural heritage. In 2024, we responded to over 50 public research queries, dedicating more than 400 hours to research activities.

Exhibitions & Collections Management

At the heart of our institution lies a commitment to preserving and showcasing Putnam County's robust history. We maintain an extensive collection of artifacts and documents, spanning hundreds of years of Putnam County and Hudson Highland's history. Our team focuses on collection care and accessibility, both in physical and digital formats.

Additionally, the PHM creates rotating exhibitions, both indoors and outdoors, to provide visitors with an accessible and relevant historical experience. Our permanent Foundry exhibition serves as a gateway to the West Point Foundry and Preserve, a National Historic Landmark. In 2025, the PHM also produced the exhibitions "Healing Hudson" with art by Selva Ozelli, "Scenes from the Hudson River School of Art" outdoor exhibition, and "Revolutionary Visions: Women in the Hudson Highlands during the American Revolution" which featured the work of five local artists interpreting historical women.




Education Outreach

Our educational programs aim to engage and inspire the community about Putnam County's local history and heritage. We organize an array of programs that evolve and expand annually. Key themes for our educational offerings include Native Americans, Colonial Period, American Revolution, Industrial Revolution, Civil War, BIPOC Histories, Women's History, Environmental History, and local history of the 19th and 20th centuries.









SERVICES PROVIDED, CONTINUED.

Lecture Series

Our long-running lecture series covers a wide range of subjects, including subjects such as art, architecture, maritime history, military history, and genealogy. Since 2020, we have adapted the series into various formats, offering virtual, hybrid, and in-person lectures to accommodate diverse audiences. In 2024, we hosted 11 lectures.

Field Trips

We collaborate with Putnam County schools and homeschool groups to design field trips that align with curricula standards and provide students with engaging experiences. These field trips often involve guided tours of the museum, West Point Foundry and Foundry Cove, and other historic locations in Putnam County. In 2024, we welcomed groups from school disctricts as close to the museum as Haldane CSD in Cold Spring, and as far away as Manhattan, serving more than 200 students.

History Hikes & Group Tours

We offer tours for groups, which may include curator-led tours of exhibitions or guided tours of historical sites located all throughout Putnam County. These popular hikes started during the pandemic but are now an annual offering at the PHM. This year we developed a new and successful tour of the historic Mountain Avenue and Nelsonville Cemeteries, which sold out three of the four tours.

Other Services & Activities

Beyond our core signature services, the PHM actively engages with the community through special events, collaborations, publications, and social media platforms. Furthermore, we continued to create an array of print publications, many of which are **available digitally**, to further promote the exploration and discovery of local history. These resources cater to diverse interests and age groups, making historical information accessible to all.
